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9. HEALTH CERTIFICATION

Approval number of the establishment:

- I, the undersigned official veterinarian, hereby certify that:
- 9.1 The boneless bovine meat and meat products are derived from cattle less than 30 months of age and which were slaughtered on or after 19 February 2014, as agreed by the United Kingdom (UK) authorities and the Government of Macao Special Administrative Region authorities;
- 9.2 The meat/meat products described above do not contain skull, brain, eyes, vertebral column, spinal cord, tonsil of terminal ileum;
- 9.3 The meat/products was/ were derived from shimals which were born or reared in the UK on or after 1 August 1996, the date from which the ban on the feeding of ruminant protein (other than milk) and mammalian meat/bone meal to ruminants is considered to have been effectively enforced;
- 9.4 The meat/products was/were derived from animals which passed ante- and post-mortem inspection under veterinary supervision at the time of their slaughter and were free from notifiable contagious, infectious and parasitic disease at the time of slaughter and that the meat was fit for human consumption;
- 9.5 The meat/products, or its/their packaging, bear(s) an EU oval mark indicating that it has been obtained, handled and stored in accordance with EU regulations and it continues to be fit for human consumption;
- 9.6 The slaughterhouse(s), cutting plants(s) and cold stores listed above are approved for export to the Macao Special Administrative Region;
- 9.7 The arimals from which the meat was derived were examined by an official veterinarian prior to slaughter for signs of a Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathy (TSE), with negative results;
- 9.8 The meat/products do not contain any specified risk material as defined in EU Regulation (EC) No. 999/2001, as amended, laying down rules for the prevention, control and eradication of certain Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies, nor mechanically separated meat derived from bones and bone-in cuts of bovine, ovine and caprine animals;
- 9.9 Cattle from which the meat or meat products destined for export originate were not subjected to a stunning process, prior to slaughter, with a device injecting compressed air or gas into the cranial cavity or to a pithing process;
- 9.10 Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) is compulsorily notifiable in the UK and an effective surveillance and monitoring system for BSE is practised in the UK in line with the current OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code. Should BSE be diagnosed, the affected cattle are slaughtered and completely destroyed;

- 9.11 Meat establishments are subject to testing programmes for harmful organisms, veterinary drug residues and other toxic substances and the programmes are administered by the competent authority. The results of the tests meet the European Community requirements and have not provided any evidence as to the presence of chemical/drug residues or toxic substance that could be harmful to human health. The tissues derived from food animals are tested to ensure they do not contain prohibited chemicals and that the levels of drugs and chemicals in tissues do not exceed the Maximum Residue Limits;
- 9.12 The meat was derived from animals that originated in the UK, which was free of foot and mouth disease and rinderpest in accordance with the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code at the time of their slaughter.
