## IV. HEALTH CERTIFICATION

- a) The meat was derived from animals which were slaughtered on or after 19 February 2008;
- b) the meat was derived from animals which have passed ante-mortem and postmortem inspection and found to be free from infectious and contagious diseases;
- c) the meat has been inspected and found fit for human consumption and every precaution has been taken to prevent contamination prior to export;
- d) they have been dressed, prepared and packed under hygienic conditions in accordance with regulations at present in force in the United Kingdom, and have been kept free from contamination prior to export;
- e) the United Kingdom is free from Rinderpest and Foot and Mouth Disease in accordance with the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code (without vaccination);
- f) the meat was derived from animals slaughtered in the United Kingdom, which has been free from classical swine fever, African swine fever, swine vesicular disease and trichinellosis<sup>1</sup> for the last six months prior to the date of slaughter of the animals and the date of the export of the product to Singapore;
- g) the meat was derived from animals which were slaughtered, processed, packed and stored under sanitary conditions under official veterinary supervision in the above-mentioned establishment approved by the Director-General, Agri-food and Veterinary Services for export to Singapore;
- h) the meat has not been treated with chemical preservatives or foreign substances injurious to health;
- j) the meat was derived from animals which have not been swill-fed;
- k) the meat was derived from animals which were born and reared in the United Kingdom since birth.
