## IV. ANIMAL HEALTH ATTESTATION

- I, the undersigned, hereby certify that:
- 1. the consignment described in Paragraph I bears oval marks which demonstrate that it is fit for human consumption and was produced in establishments in compliance with the conditions laid down in Regulations (EC) Nos, 852/2004, 853/2004 and 854/2004 and other EU legislation for maximum residue limits of veterinary medical products in food stuffs of animal origin and compliance with microbiological standards, which ensures that food is free from physical, chemical and microbiological hazards.
- 2. UK law prohibits the sale or supply of milk from cows affected or suspected of being affected with Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy;
- 3. the feeding of ruminant protein to ruminants has been prohibited in Great Britain since July 1988, and in Northern Ireland since January 1989;
- 4. the United Kingdom has a comprehensive programme in place to monitor radioactivity in food and the environment. The results demonstrates that even the most exposed members of the UK public received radiation doses from consumption of local food and exposure to environmental radioactivity (due to discharges and direct radiation) that were below the statutory EU annual dose limit to members of the public of 1 millisievert per year from artificially-produced radionuclides as set in the Council Directive 96/29/Euratom of 13 May 1996;

5. the milk/meat/poultry meat (and meat/poultry meat used in the manufacture of preparations/products, unless the products have been processed to destroy the relevant virus) was not derived from animals which originated from holdings situated within a ten kilometre radius of a holding in which the following OIE Listed diseases to which the species of origin is susceptible have been confirmed during the previous three months: African swine fever, classical swine fever, swine vesicular disease, Newcastle disease, Foot and Mouth Disease or avian influenza.
