I, the undersigned, certify that the products described at paragraph I above meet the following requirements:

- a) they were derived from meat obtained under conditions governing production and control laid down in European Community legislation on health problems affecting intra-community trade in fresh meat;
- b) the animal/s from which they were derived were subjected to ante and post-mortem inspection under official veterinary supervision and no clinical evidence of notifiable infectious or contagious disease was observed;
- c) the animals from which they were derived were examined under official veterinary supervision immediately after slaughter and found fit for human consumption in accordance with legislation currently in force in the European Union (EU);
- d) the animals were slaughtered and the meat products prepared in establishments approved for trade within the EU;
- e) the animals from which they were derived originate from holdings on which no outbreak of Foot and Mouth disease, Contagious Bovine Pleuropneumonia, Vesicular Stomatitis, Rinderpest, Swine Fever, African Swine Fever or Swine Vesicular Disease has been confirmed during the twelve months immediately prior to their slaughter for export;
- f) the meat products have been produced, handled, stored and transported in such a way as to prevent contact with any animal products which are not similarly certifiable;
- g) the meat products are oval marked to denote that they are acceptable for human consumption in the United Kingdom.
