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**EXPORT TO ST. KITTS OF MEAT PRODUCTS OF BIUNGULATE ORIGIN
(EXCLUDING BEEF PRODUCTS) - 5750EHC**

NOTES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE CERTIFYING OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN

1. Certification by an Official Veterinarian

This certificate may be signed by an Official Veterinarian appointed by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, The Scottish Executive Environment and Rural Affairs Department or the National Assembly for Wales who is on the appropriate panel for export purposes. OV's should affix the OV stamp to the certificate in the normal manner.

2. Paragraph I e) (i) and (ii) - The certifying veterinarian should insert both container and seal number.

3. Paragraph IV 1. a) - c), 2. and 3. may be certified on the basis of health marks and commercial documents which demonstrate that the meat originates from a plant which is approved for intra-community trade and that the meat has been passed fit for human consumption.

4. Paragraph IV 1. d): EU legislation prohibits the movement of animals or animal products from holdings under restrictions for OIE List A diseases.
OIE List A diseases to which sheep are susceptible: foot and mouth disease, bluetongue, sheep pox, peste des petits ruminants, Rift Valley fever.
OIE List A diseases to which pigs are susceptible: foot and mouth disease, vesicular stomatitis, swine vesicular disease, African swine fever, classical swine fever.
OIE List A disease to which horses are susceptible: African horse sickness, glanders.

5. A certified copy of the completed certificate must be sent to the issuing office (in GB, Animal Health, Specialist Service Centre (SSC) - Exports, Carlisle) on the day of issue.
