3 Have blood samples been taken from the donor sheep/goats and submitted to the complement fixation test for brucellosis (B melitensis) within 30 days prior to semen collection with negative results? Date(s) of test		
4 Have blood samples been taken from the donor sheep/goats and submitted to the complement fixation test for Brucella ovis within 30 days prior to collection with negative results? Date(s) of test		
5 Have blood samples been taken from the donor sheep/goats and submitted to the immunoperoxidase test for border disease within 30 days prior to collection with negative results? Date(s) of test
