#### EXPORT OF PORK MEAT AND PORK MEAT PRODUCTS TO JORDAN 6393EHC

#### NOTES FOR GUIDANCE OF THE EXPORTER AND OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN

These notes provide guidance to Official Veterinarians (OV) and exporters. The Notes for Guidance (NFG) should have been issued to you together with export certificate 6393EHC. The NFG should not be read as a standalone document but in conjunction with certificate 6393EHC. We strongly suggest that exporters obtain full details of the importing country's requirements from the veterinary authorities in the country concerned, or their representatives in the UK, in advance of each consignment.

### 1. SCOPE

Export Health certificate 6393EHC can be used for pork meat and pork meat products of UK or EU origin for export from the UK to Jordan.

# 2. CERTIFICATION BY AN OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN

This certificate may be signed by an OV appointed by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, the Scottish Government or the Welsh Government, who is on the appropriate panel for export purposes or who holds the appropriate Official Controls Qualification (Veterinary)(OCQ(V)) authorisation, or an Authorised Veterinary Inspector (AVI) appointed by the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs - Northern Ireland (DAERA).

OVs/AVIs should sign and stamp the health certificate with the OV/AVI stamp in any colour OTHER THAN BLACK.

A certified copy of the completed certificate must be sent to the issuing office (in GB - the Centre for International Trade, Carlisle) within seven days of signing, or in the case of Northern Ireland, to DAERA, Dundonald House, Belfast.

The OV/AVI should keep a copy for his/her own records.

### 3. NOTIFIABLE DISEASE CLEARANCE

Paragraph IV.(a) can be certified on behalf of the Department provided written authority to do so on form 618NDC has been obtained from the issuing office.

### 4. ORIGIN OF THE ANIMALS

Paragraph IV (b) can be certified on the basis of familiarity with procurement policy at the slaughterhouse/s, cold store/s and examination of appropriate records.

## 5. FITNESS FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION

Paragraphs IV(c), IV(d) and IV(e) may be certified on the basis of the EU oval mark and evidence that the slaughterhouse, cutting plant, meat products plant (if applicable) and cold store are officially approved and operating in accordance with the General Food Law Regulation (EC) 178/2002 together with Regulations (EC) Nos. 852/2004, 853/2004 and 854/2004 and 2073/2005 (The EU Hygiene Regulations). These Regulations are enforced in all MSs of the EU.

In the UK, the primary food legislation providing the framework for all food legislation in England, Wales and Scotland is The Food Safety Act 1990 (as amended). Similar legislation applies in Northern Ireland.

Enforcement of the General Food Law Regulation (EC) 178/2002 and implementation and enforcement of the EU Hygiene Regulations is provided though secondary legislation in England by The Food Safety and Hygiene (England) Regulations 2013 (as amended) and parallel legislation in Wales and Scotland. In Northern Ireland it is provided by The Food Hygiene Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006.
