EXPORT OF BOVINE SEMEN TO CAYMAN ISLANDS

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE FOR OFFICIAL VETERINARIANS AND EXPORTERS

IMPORTANT

These notes provide guidance to Official Veterinarians (OV's) and exporters and should have been issued to you together with export certificate 7436EHC. These Notes for Guidance (NFG) are not intended to operate as a standalone document but in conjunction with certificate 7436EHC.

Exporters are strongly advised to verify the requirements of the importing country by contacting the veterinary authorities, or their representatives in the UK, in advance of each consignment.

Scope of the Certificate

Export health certificate 7436EHC may be used for the bovine semen from the United Kingdom to the Cayman Islands.

A certified copy of the completed certificate must be sent to the Animal Health and Veterinary Laboratories Agency (AHVLA) Specialist Service Centre - Exports at Car sle within seven days of signing, or in the case Northern Ireland to DARD, Dundonald House, Belfast.

The OV should keep copy for his/her own records.

Obtaining an import permit

The exporter agent should be aware of the requirements of the importing country particularly with respect to the requirement for an The import permit number should be given in the health impor permi rt.ifi at paragraph III.5).

Schedules

graph I refers: A separate schedule may be used to identify the mals certified. This schedule must contain the same information as that required in paragraph I and paragraph I must be annotated "See athached schedule". Each page of the schedule must bear a page number the health certificate reference number and must be signed, dated and stamped by the Official Veterinarian (OV).

The schedule must be stapled inside the health certificate and the OV should "fan" and stamp over the pages of the schedule and certificate. The top stapled corner of the schedule and certificate should be folded over and stamped also. Any blank spaces in the schedule or in paragraph I must be deleted with diagonal lines.

Notifiable disease clearance (form 618NDC)

Paragraph IV.1) refers: OVs may certify paragraph IV.1) on behalf of the Department provided written authority to do so has been obtained on form 618NDC from the AHVLA Specialist Service Centre - Exports - at Carlisle or the issuing office of DARD in Northern Ireland.

6. Laboratory tests

The OV must ensure that any laboratory carrying out pre-export testing is officially approved for this purpose by Defra or DARD.

In Great Britain (England, Wales and Scotland), the majority of preexport testing is carried out at the AHVLA Laboratory, New Haw, Weybridge, Addlestone, Surrey, KT15 3NB, (Tel: 01932 341111). Some tests are carried out at AHVLA Lasswade, Pentlands Science Park, Bush Loan, Penicuick, Midlothian, EH26 OPZ, (Tel: 0131 445 6169). Certain specialist tests are carried out at regional AHVLA laboratories.

In Northern Ireland, the majority of pre-export testing is carried out at the Veterinary Sciences Division (VSD) Laboratory, Stormont, Belfast, BT4 3SD (tel: 028 9052 0011).

For operational reasons however, the laboratories involved may change periodically. Accordingly, the OV is advised to check with the AHVLA or VSD to determine to which laboratories samples should be sent for testing. Samples should always be sent to the laboratory concerned sufficiently in advance of the export date to enable the test carried out and reported. If in doubt as to the procedures for collection, the requirement for transport medium if any, dispatch of samples and the length of time a test is likely to take, he OV should seek the advice of the relevant laboratory.

7. Sealing of the transport container

Sealing of the transport container.

Paragraph IV.11)c) refers: The semen must be secured within a cryogenic container by a tamperproof seal applied in such a way that the container cannot be opened without breaking the seal. The number on the seal must be entered at paragraph III 3) on the health certificate.

If it is necessary to top up the container, topping up should be done in the presence of an official Veterinarian (OV) who must apply a new tamperproof seal. The OV must endorse paragraph III.3) on the health certificate with the new seal number, giving name and signature and dating and stamping the endorsemen in the margin of the certificate in any ink colour other than black
